MARKET SUMMARY

The market closed the week with a turnover of UGX 344,087,855 and a total volume of 2,015,806 shares traded. The USE All Share Index closed the week at a high level of 1,044.26 from last week's 1,011.54. Total market capitalization closed at UGX 6,371.72 billion.

During the last session, NVL traded 14,500 shares at a new high of UGX 2,285 per share, SBU traded 732,482 shares closing at Ugx 235 per share, DFCU traded 185,868 shares closing at a high of UGX 820 per share, BOBU traded 500 shares at a high of 3,730 per share and UCL normal counter traded 509 shares at an after split high of Ugx 7,000 per share. Outstanding bids and offers were registered on the SBU, UCL, NVL, DFCU and BATU counters.

Earlier this week, the East African region saw the close of the Safaricom IPO .
